Clinical question

Question 2

Clinical question

A 35-year-old male undergoing abdominal surgery under general anaesthesia develops sudden generalised muscle rigidity, rapid increase in body temperature, and tachycardia shortly after administration of sevoflurane and succinylcholine. His end-tidal CO₂ is rising despite controlled ventilation. What is the most appropriate immediate treatment?

Options:

- A) Dantrolene
- B) Paracetamol
- C) Calcium chloride
- D) Propranolol

Correct answer: A) Dantrolene
